

**DOSTOEVSKY OMSK STATE UNIVERSITY OFFERS
PREPARATORY PROGRAMME TO FOREIGNERS**

WHO WANT TO STUDY IN RUSSIA OR WHO ARE
WILLING TO IMPROVE RUSSIAN LANGUAGE
SKILLS.

The Preparatory programme lasts for the whole academic year (from September to June), it is worth 35 credits and is divided into two terms. **In the first semester**, students learn general Russian language. **The second semester** covers a balance of language skills (speaking, listening, reading, and writing), grammar and vocabulary with a special focus on academic language.

The preparatory programme includes 1400 hours of Russian (20 hours of Russian per week, 5 times x 2 lessons a day), as well as profession-oriented subjects (612 hours) needed to enter OmSU or any other university in Russia.

Educational specializations:

- Natural sciences (mathematics, physics, chemistry)
- Engineering and technology (mathematics, physics, IT)
- Humanities (social studies, history, literature)
- Economics (social studies, history, mathematics)
- Medico-biological programme (chemistry, biology, physics)

AT THE END OF THE COURSE, STUDENTS TAKE EXAMINATIONS IN RUSSIAN.



Course Fees: 70 000 P (approx. 1100 USD).
Accommodation fees are 500 RUB (approx. 7-9 USD) in a shared room at the university dormitory or you can get a single room, which will cost 5000 RUB (approx. 75 USD). **Food expenses** are about 300 RUB per day (approx. 5-6 USD).

COURSE TOPICS:

You will be divided into classes based on your actual knowledge of Russian. Classes are designed to help students feel comfortable learning Russian.

RUSSIAN COURSE SYLLABUS 1ST TERM

Speaking:

- pronunciation rules, alphabet;
- communication in different spheres of human life.

Listening:

- understanding real life situations, listening for general meaning, details, pronunciation, stress and intonation;

Reading:

- understanding story sequence;
- understanding authentic writing

Writing:

- organizing writing using a range of styles;
- writing formal and informal letters and e-mails.

Grammar:

- verb tenses;
- kinds of sentences, cases of nouns.

Vocabulary:

- introducing yourself, bio: childhood, study, work, hobbies;
- my family, my friends;
- my day, my spare time, leisure, hobbies;
- foreign language study;
- my native city, capital.

Academic Speaking:

- delivering oral presentations;
